

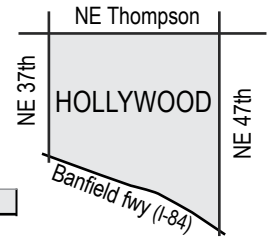


UPCOMING HOLLYWOOD NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION GENERAL MEETING

TRANSPORTATION MATTERS

****NEEDS IMMEDIATE ATTENTION****

Please express your support for the City of Portland and TriMet's joint application for MTIP (Metro Transportation Improvement Project) funds for the Hollywood Transit Center (HTC). On November 16th from 5 to 8pm at Metro headquarters, 600 NE Grand Avenue, public testimony will be taken at the Metro Council Meeting Chambers on MTIP matters. Also, written comments may be sent to Metro (MTIP) either by letter or e-mail trans@metro.dst.or.us and you may call the Metro Transportation Hotline at 503-797-1900; you have until the end of the day, December 1st to do this. If you prefer, you may e-mail the Council President David Bragdon bragdond@metro.dst.or.us addressing your comments to him and the Council. Also, our area's Council representative is Rex Burkholder; e-mail him at burkholderr@metro.dst.or.us or phone him at 503-797-1546.

The continuing development of Hollywood following the Hollywood and Sandy Plan may include using the transit center property for a multi-use building. Funds are needed to develop site plans—this is why we need money from MTIP. We may lose these needed funds without support from our community as we face stiff competition for these monies.

Points to address with Metro Council:

- * Hollywood is a Metro 2040 Station Community and Town Center.

- * In the 2000 community planning process (Hollywood and Sandy Plan) Hollywood was upzoned to accommodate population and job growth, which is happening not only in the station area, but also in the entire Town Center.

- * An upgraded HTC would better handle multi-modal issues and safety concerns created with the poor original design.

* The current configuration of the HTC precludes significant development on the site.

* A recent study by the City of Portland and TriMet confirmed that there are feasible options for moving the buses off-site.

David Emami, who owns the property immediately north of Sandy Boulevard between 41st and 42nd (where Rite-Aid is located), would like to add on-street parking to the north side of Sandy on that block. His surrogate Brad Perkins will present his arguments for this at the November 30 meeting.

Chris Armes, City of Portland manager of the Sandy resurfacing project, and Lewis Wardrip, project transportation engineer, will present the City's perspective at the same meeting.

After these presentations, there will be an opportunity for statements and questions from the floor before a vote of the membership is taken.

Graffiti Abatement Program

The Office of Neighborhood Involvement (ONI) works with neighbors and business-owners to locate, report and remove graffiti from public and private spaces. We work towards accomplishing this goal in several ways; forming neighborhood graffiti patrols, contracting with YEI and Goodbye Graffiti to provide free or low cost graffiti removal, Working with Portland Police Bureau's Graffiti Hotline: (503) 823-4TAG (4824), chairing the monthly Graffiti Task Force meeting of partner agencies.

Research shows that prompt and persistent removal is effective in discouraging repeat vandalism. The Graffiti Coordinator (GAC) works with the Police, District Attorney (DA), and

neighbors to reduce graffiti in your area. Report graffiti, using Portland Online (go to www.portlandonline.com and type 'graffiti' in their site search), or email (mdennis@ci.portland.or.us). Identify the location, attach a digital photo to your online report, or mail to: GAC, 111 SW Columbia St., Ste 670, Portland, OR 97201. The photos assist the Police and DA in prosecuting criminals. Remove graffiti (paint over, or clean with solvent) as soon as it appears or call the GAC at 503-823-5860 for free removal. Report graffiti, even if you removed it. For traffic sign cleanup call 503-823-1703.

Hollywood Sewer Project

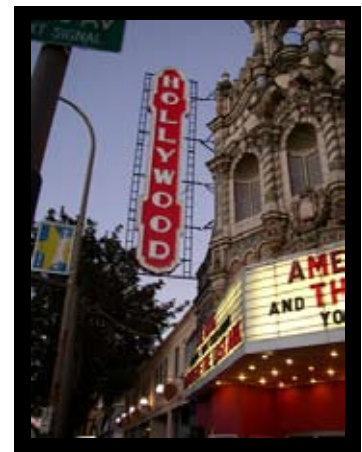
The sewer project has mostly moved to the blocks north and south of Sandy. It looks like the project is nearing its final phase.
